Moderate **continental climate**, generally warm summers with average temperatures between 18°C and 30°C and rather cold winters with average temperatures around 3°C in the north-west and -6°C in the north-east


Our curricula are tailored to employers' needs

AULA Academic Theatre - in

continuous operation for eight years. The theatre group was founded in 2014 and the official act of founding the AULA Academic Theatre took place in 2015. The theatre activities are a voluntary form of acquiring knowledge and skills in acting and theatre arts. Following the path of classical drama theatre, visual storytelling in a live setting, but also experimentation and exploration of artistic expression, the theatre provides students, academics and the local community with a forum for an alternative way of self-expression, commentary and dialogue with the environment. We have already had fourteen performances. We also run projects: artistic, musical and cultural research projects in the humanities in the broadest sense. The AULA theatre stage is a place for the development of passions, open to all who want to get to know themselves and go beyond their own limits,.

Multiple opportunities for development

We are one of the few non-public universities in the country to offer such a modern education in so many disciplines. These include pedagogy, psychology, social communication and media sciences, health sciences, information technology, security sciences, political and administrative sciences, management and quality sciences. Our graduates are professional educators, psychologists, social workers, therapists and teachers. There is more to it! Bachelor's degree

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These are first-cycle studies leading to a Bachelor's degree.



The program lasts six semesters, or three years, during which students gain practical knowledge and professional experience.



This is the most popular type of tertiary education at DSW Univeristy of Lower Silesia. Currently, we offer as many as sixteen undergraduate programs in various fields.

The graduates can apply for jobs that require a tertiary education diploma. They can also pursue their education further at Master's, Master's with postgraduate, independent postgraduate or MBA programs.

Engineering program

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
These are first-cycle studies concluding with obtaining a degree in engineering.



The program lasts seven semesters, or three and a half years, during which students gain practical knowledge and professional experience.



During these studies, the majors include knowledge of engineering and technical sciences. At DSW Univeristy of Lower Silesia, we offer three fields of study: Logistics, Engineering Management, and IT.



Full-time studies

In full-time studies, classes are held on weekdays. We try to arrange classes so that you can do all the compulsory classes 3-4 days a week.

Part-time studies

The timetable is organized over weekend meetings (and some Friday evenings, online) in these studies, on average, once every two weeks.

Long-cycle Master's degree

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These studies end with obtaining a Master's degree. Under the law on tertiary education, they must not be divided into first-cycle and second-cycle studies.



The program lasts ten semesters, or five years, during which students gain practical knowledge and professional experience.



At DSW Univeristy of Lower Silesia, we offer longcycle Master's studies in law, psychology, and pre-school and early school education.

Master's degree

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Students can enroll in them after obtaining a Bachelor's or engineering degree.



These studies last two years (four semesters) and end with the thesis's defence and obtaining a Master's degree.

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The graduates can pursue their education further at Master's with postgraduate, independent postgraduate or MBA programs.
